



CSASK'S CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK REQUIREMENT

As part of its commitment to protect the public, the College of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists of Saskatchewan (CSASK) now requires a criminal record check for registration and licensing. CSASK, along with other health profession regulators in Saskatchewan and other regulators of audiology and speech-language pathology in Canada, has implemented more rigorous screening processes for applicants and registrants as an additional measure of public protection.

To meet the criminal record check (CRC) requirements outlined in CSASK bylaws and policy:

- CSASK applicants (except those seeking temporary registration or cross provincial practice licensure) shall obtain a criminal record check.
- CSASK practising registrants, where it has been more than five years since they have provided a criminal record check to CSASK, shall provide a CRC dated within the previous six months.
- Applicants/registrants who are not a resident or has not resided in Canada within the previous six months, shall provide another form of documentation to establish that they do not have the equivalent of a criminal record in their country of residence or previous residence.
- The type of CRC required by CSASK is the Enhanced Police Information Check (E-PIC) completed through Sterling Backcheck.
 - A CRC conducted through another source or without using the CSASK landing page of the Sterling Backcheck website will not be accepted. Please contact the CSASK office if you have completed an E-PIC through Sterling Backcheck in the previous six months.

WHY DOES CSASK ONLY ACCEPT CRC'S COMPLETED THROUGH STERLING BACKCHECK?

Sterling Backcheck serves government agencies, major retailers, banks, and tech companies who have the highest standards for protecting personal information. Following extensive deliberation and research, CSASK council decided that CRCs would be completed exclusively through Sterling Backcheck. Sterling Backcheck is commonly used among health profession regulators due to the quality of the reports, protection of confidential and sensitive applicant/registrant information, fairness to registrants, accessibility, and operational efficiency.

The E-PIC Consists of Two Components:

- **Criminal Record Check (CRC)** - A search of adult convictions held within the RCMP National Repository of Criminal Records.
- **Local Police Information (LPI)** - A search of additional convictions located outside of the National Repository and judicial matters reported by local police jurisdictions.

Enhanced Police Information Check:

In addition to criminal convictions reported in the RCMP National Repository, E-PIC includes a search of local police data sources that will provide the college with information regarding active judicial

- criminal charges and pending charges
- warrants
- peace bonds
- prohibition orders
- probation orders
- release conditions
- non-conviction outcomes
- interim release conditions
- recent convictions that are not yet listed in the RCMP National Repository of Criminal Records.

In contrast, a standard CRC is a name-based search of the RCMP National Repository of Criminal Records only.

WHERE DOES STERLING BACKCHECK ACCESS INFORMATION TO VERIFY IDENTIFICATION

Sterling Backcheck serves government agencies, major retailers, banks, and tech companies who have the highest standards for protecting personal information. In addition, Sterling Backcheck is commonly used among health profession regulators.

Sterling Backcheck has a partnership with TransUnion, a major Canadian credit bureau, to offer Electronic ID Verification (EIV) as a means of securely verifying your identity online using your unique consumer credit file. Sterling Backcheck does not have access to the candidate's credit information EIV does not require the credit report to be pulled and has no effect on your credit score/rating. Alternate and in-person ID verification is available, by printing out a form and bringing two pieces of identification to Canada Post. Candidates should review the requirements for acceptable proof of ID to ensure they have the necessary documents on hand.
