- ✓ **Universal Design of Learning**
Karen will explore some of the participation barriers that may exist, and use stories to illustrate the practical strategies used by educators to provide opportunities for children who use AAC to participate, connect, and contribute within the classroom community.
- ✓ **The Why & How of Literacy**
Karen will make the argument that literacy is the most important life skill students can learn in school.
